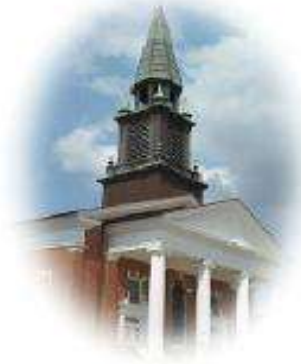

Walking in a Winter Wonderland at First Presbyterian Church on Sunday Mornings at 9:45 a.m.

Preschool Children will meet in CE108 for their fabulous Sunday school time filled with singing, crafts, and a Bible story.

Children in kindergarten through fifth grade will focus on *The Triumphal Entry* during the Workshop Rotation. During this six week lesson, children will be able to experience the Bible story through computers, art, science, storytelling, cooking, and movies.

Middle School and High School Youth will meet in the Student Center as they share in discussions that focus on the major events and teachings in Jesus' life. Both groups meet together for a time of prayer and fellowship and then break into two separate groups for sharing. These classes are taught by a rotation of volunteers from our congregation.

Adult Sunday School Classes

The Perspectives Class will continue their discussion on *Who is Jesus* by Marcus Borg with Dr. Jim Threlkel and Mr. Glenn Thomas as facilitators. Please feel free to drop in even if you didn't participate last year. The class meets in the Geneva Room.

Ancient Israel and Early Judaism - Join discussion leader Bob Hubbard in a study of the history, literature, and religion of ancient Israel and early Judaism as presented in the pages of the Old Testament. This will not be your typical Bible study class! It will center around a lecture series presented on DVD by Professor Amy-Jill Levine of Vanderbilt University Divinity School. Although this is a college level course, Dr. Levine has a delightful and very down-to-earth teaching style that anyone will be able to understand and learn from. The class will run for 24 weeks, through May 23, 2010. Each lecture lasts about 30 minutes and will be followed by class discussion or question time. Come enjoy this fascinating and eye-opening journey through the pages of Part One of the world's best-selling book.

Having a Mary Heart in a Martha World written by Joanna Weaver is the book study led by Lori Grode. This class will focus on finding intimacy with God in the busyness of life. Books are available for purchase. This class meets in CE Room 207.

Since the order for butterflies needs to be placed soon., *please have your orders in by Palm Sunday, March 28.* Thank you!

Steve's simple rice and beans. While I enjoy great northern beans which have been soaked overnight and slow cooked with a little ham as well as other marvelous ways of tantalizing our taste buds with a simple meal of beans and rice, I hope people will share their special recipes with us in the next few weeks of Lent. I also want to mention a few quick ways to simply eat beans and rice so that others might simply eat. Our local grocery stores stock canned beans which are affordable and tasty – a can of these pre-seasoned and pre-cooked pintos, red beans, or black beans costs less than \$1.75. They can be heated while you are cooking your favorite rice (brown, white, or yellow) and in less than 30 minutes and for less than \$4.00, two people can eat their fill. In the dried beans and rice section of the grocery store aisles, you can also buy combined beans and rice dinners for less than \$2.00 per person. *Enjoy the meal and the joy of sharing what you can by feeding others in our church missions this Lent.*
