Festival of Church Artisans

From our childhood we have enjoyed seeing our handiwork appreciated, as parents would put our art or writing on the refrigerator at home or on a desk at work to be admired by all who would see them. As children, we enjoyed making our marks whether it was carving our initials in a tree or making something for others to see. As adults, we still enjoy "making our mark on the world" -- being creative and productive while having others admire and appreciate what we have done.

The Festival of Church Artisans is going to provide our church family an opportunity for people interested or skilled in the arts to make contributions to the life and worship of this congregation.

Pam Baker will lead a class in making a beautiful Advent Banner to grace our sanctuary for years to come as we prepare to celebrate Christmas. She was involved in the construction of the wall hangings made at Vacation Bible Schools years ago, which hang in the Christian Education Building. Wouldn't you like to be part of the group who will make this banner to be used year after year?

Nancy Dobler will be leading a class in Counted Cross Stitch. Once you learn the basics, you will be able to make any number of designs and projects. This class will focus on making Chrismons, which will hang on the tree in the narthex. Many of our older Chrismons made with beads, braid, pins, sequins, styrofoam and wire have shown their wear after years of use. These new Chrismons while being beautiful are also much easier to store and will wear better. It will be quite easy for you to make some for use here and then make some for your own tree at home. How about joining this class?

Mary Ellen Porter will direct a class in painting a large mural/backdrop. Some of you may recall the one that has hung here at the church for years which was most recently used as a backdrop for the Church Retreat in McLeod Hall. This group will paint a Biblical landscape scene that will be used in our Storytelling Center of our children's Sunday School. Once you learn some techniques here you might volunteer to help with painting sets for Theater Winter Haven or other productions. Once again you have the opportunity to lend your hands to a project that will be used for years here at the church. I would suggest that all participants might sign their names on the back of the canvas so years from now we will know who made this wall hanging.

Mark Sanders will oversee the Woodworking Group. This group is going to build and finish two more pedestals/plant stands. It seems that we are always needing more of these than are available for use. They come in handy for memorial services and special events. Those joining this group could even carve your initials in the wood where they would not be readily seen!

Not all art forms are as lasting as those above. It was John Keats who wrote, "A thing of beauty is a joy forever." Peggy Davis will lead a class in Flower Arranging for Church and Home. "The grass withers and the flower fades ..." but thanks to the gift of memory and photographs we can enjoy floral arrangements longer. She will instruct on the basics of floral arranging and offer specific suggestions for designs appropriate for worship settings. This group will make a green arrangement for use at a Sunday service in August.

THROUGH OUR SATURDAY SOUP KITCHEN MINISTRY

Saturday Soup Kitchen

In Matthew 25:31-46 Jesus tells the poignant parable known as the "Sheep and the Goats", where we find that as disciples feed the least of our human brothers and sisters, we actually have fed the Lord Jesus.

This parable has become the basis for what First Presbyterian Church calls our Saturday Soup Kitchen.



For several years, our weekly ministry of providing a hot meal in the name of Jesus Christ to the hungry in our community has fed the bellies and souls of guests, and filled the souls of our volunteers.

Throughout the summer, we have averaged nearly 90 supper guests each week.

The crews usually meet in the church kitchen around 2:00 p.m. Saturday for food prep and set-up. The serving hour at our 737 building is 4:00-5:00 p.m. Clean-up is usually done in 30 minutes, and the volunteers are out the door by 5:30 p.m.—filled with the knowledge that lots of our neighbors will not go to bed hungry that night!



There are two categories of volunteers "head cooks and helpers",

Head Cooks need to:

- 1) Plan the menu (we have a "Food For Fifty" Cookbook)
- 2) Arrange for securing the food
- 3) Call the people who have signed up to divide labor and set a cooking time
- 4) Secure the keys and instruction book from the church office before Saturday
- 5) Make sure that volunteers are introduced to one another and have a job
- 6) Lock it all up at the end

(Please note, Head Cooks do not have to donate the food for the meal. Publix is currently supplying all the bread and desserts needed. The church (through the Deacon's fund, etc.) will reimburse Head Cooks for all food expenses.)

Mission Honduras 2009 — In Their Own Words

From June 20-27, 2009, our congregation sponsored a 29-member mission team to the country of Honduras. This group was our church's sixth week-long mission adventure over the past 11 years, in partnership with the churches in the Presbytery of Honduras and the Presbytery of Tampa Bay. The generous support of our congregation has made this continuing ministry possible. God is doing marvelous things in the lives of our members and our Honduran Christian brothers and sisters. Amy Smith, our Church Educator, was a member of the 2009 Mission Team. Here's how she describes the experience:

Amy Smith – Mission Team 2009

Eleven years ago I had the unique opportunity to be part of First Presbyterian Church's first Mission Team to Honduras. During our visit, I discovered so many things about myself, the other folks on the team, and the delightful people of Honduras. On our very first journey to this foreign land, we visited areas that people should not even have to walk through, much less live in, day in and day out. Upon returning home, I often wondered if I would have a chance, an opportunity, or the courage to visit Honduras again. Would it touch me the same way it did back then?



In 2009, eleven years later the invitation was presented and I quickly decided it was time for me to return. I was a little nervous and anxious about returning, especially not knowing where exactly we would be staying and what all we might encounter, but I felt the Lord calling me to pack my bags and go where He was leading me. Several images and occurrences flash through my mind when I think back to our week long journey there.

Our first full day in Honduras was a Sunday. It was a day filled with traveling to the town of Nacaome, which would quickly become our home away from home. We settled into our hotel and had the privilege to worship at the local church where we would be doing construction as well as medical missions during our stay. Pastor Gloria welcomed us upon our arrival with hugs and well wishes. Soon the music began and chill bumps ran up and down my entire body. I was taken back to my very first visit to Honduras and worshipping at a church very similar to the one in Nacaome. Presbyterian worship services in Honduras are quite a bit different than the ones we are familiar with. There is a lot of continuous singing and clapping, where just when you think the song has ended, the worship leader quickly goes into a new celebration of praise. I am not able to tell you the lyrics of the songs, but I can tell you what the songs were about. You could feel it by the way the members of the congregation held up their hands in total praise to our Wonderful Creator, you could see it on the children's faces as they played the tambourines with such joy, and you could hear it as their glorious words of praise echoed through the splendid church. What a wonderful and joyous way to begin our week in Honduras.

On Tuesday after a day of traveling up and down mountains, most of us ended up in Nacaome to assist in painting the inside of the church. Since there were several children gathered outside to see what the Americans were doing, a few of us decided to play some games and do crafts with the children to provide entertainment and have the opportunity to fellowship with them. As we were teaching them this new game of plato, plato, ganso or duck, duck, goose, we saw a little girl about three or four years old, standing on the sidelines, wanting to jump in, but too shy to do so. So I quickly went over to her, had her sit by me and was able to get her to join in the game. Soon she was laughing, running, and playing just like all the other children. When it was time to color, she took her time, coloring so very beautifully. Her smile and her eyes completely melted my heart and so I was sure to take a picture of her to remind me that even though the years may pass, pieces of me will remain in Honduras.





On Wednesday, I had the chance to revisit Morcopay which we had visited earlier in the week doing a Medical Mission. This time I would serve on the Construction Team for the day. On the way there, I was really pumped and excited to be doing something completely out of my usual comfort zone. Even though I wasn't really sure what to expect, I was excited that perhaps the Lord would grant me a few talents for the day or bring something out in me which I didn't know I had. I quickly learned that anyone can haul rocks out of the river, and if the rocks are too heavy, as long as you stand in between Warren Glenn and David Alexander, Warren will skip over you and pass the rocks onto David. Mixing concrete by hand is not as easy as it looks and I immediately had a much greater respect for those who do that for a living and for those who have never

had the opportunity to use a concrete mixer. Tying rebar is an art that I had learned eleven years earlier but it's amazing how quickly you can re-learn the art if Dr. Negley shows you enough times. Finally the day wrapped up with an afternoon of blowing bubbles with the children. Ahhh, finally something we can all be good at! What great fun something so simple can be. The children had a great time catching them, blowing the bubbles, and sharing in something together. It didn't matter if I spoke Spanish, English, or where I was from; the fact that we could all smile and laugh together made all the difference in the world.

This year we had two incredible hosts: Alex and Noel who are part of the Presbyterian Churches of Honduras. From the time we arrived at the airport in Tegucigalpa until the time we flew out of Tegucigalpa, these two extraordinary Christian men, ambassadors of Christ, graciously welcomed us into their country with open arms. They were by our side through all our many travels, adventures, and situations. From changing our truck's flat tire in a terrible rain storm, to helping to push trucks up a bed of rocks, to making sure we were safe at all times, and helping me order a chocolate milkshake in Spanish, they were absolutely incredible. They touched our lives in such a way, when I think back to Honduras and some of the folks I met along the way, I will immediately think of them.



It is a great testament to the Lord that there were 29 men, women, teenagers, adults, mothers, fathers, grandparents and siblings, who came together to share God's love to this impoverished nation. We truly had a diverse group of people with various backgrounds, age groups, and interests serving as the Mission Team from First Presbyterian. Many of us left home, knowing each other as acquaintances but returned home as members of a family. We now have a bond which will connect us all for the rest of our lives; we are the 2009 Mission Honduras Team.



The people of Honduras have truly touched my heart and though I do not consider myself called to the Mission Field on a regular basis, serving them, learning about them, and reaching out to them, was truly a gift from God. I am so blessed and thankful that I was able to be a part of the 1998 Mission Team and 2009 Mission Team. I pray that God's blessings will be upon the people of Honduras. May His glorious will be done.
