





# HYMNS FROM *GLORY TO GOD*

Saint Patrick was born around 380 A.D. in what is now Scotland. He was raised in a Christian home, but was kidnapped when 16 years old by raiders who took him as a slave back to Ireland. Six years later he escaped and returned home to his family. One night he had a dream where he saw an Irishman pleading for him to come evangelize in Ireland. He entered the priesthood and followed God's call back to the land of his pagan kidnappers.

At the time, Irish High King Laoire was trying to stem the spread of Christianity; to that end he decreed that no one shall light a fire until the pagan spring festival was launched by the lighting of a fire on Slane hill. Legend says that Saint Patrick defied this edict; he climbed Slane hill and lit a fire on Easter Eve to honor God despite the threat of death. It was said that the fire could not be doused by anyone but Patrick. King Logaire was so impressed with Patrick's brave devotion, he let him continue his missionary work unhindered. It was also on the Slane hill that Patrick used the shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity.

An 8th Century monk named Dallan Forgaill penned the words to *Be Thou My Vision*, as a tribute to St. Patrick's wholehearted loyalty to God. Many years later the hymn became associated with an ancient Irish folk tune called *Slane*. It entered into Christian worship and quickly became a favorite of many.

Since 1933, *Be Thou My Vision* has appeared in Presbyterian Hymnals. For whatever reasons, the editors of the 1990 hymnal removed the fourth verse of *Be Thou My Vision* which begins "High King of Heaven." In *Glory to God* we have the restoration of the original, and its fourth verse.

### PLEASE JOIN US AT ONE OF OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES


**Preschool Children** – Meet in Room 108 for their very own time of Bible stories, craft, and snack time.

How can we find God?



## GLORY TO GOD, THE PRESBYTERIAN HYMNAL

Over a period of three and a half years, the Presbyterian Committee on Congregational Song met regularly to sing, discuss, and consider thousands of hymns and songs to be included in the new Presbyterian hymnal. In 2012, the new hymnal was presented to the General Assembly and it was commended for use within the church. In late 2013, the hymnals were printed and began to be used in worship. After thorough discussion and consideration, the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Winter Haven has adopted the new Presbyterian Hymnal *Glory to God* for use in worship.

### QUICK FACTS

- *Glory to God* contains 853 hymns, compared to 605 of the current Blue hymnal.
- 65% of the Blue hymnal is in *Glory to God*; which basically means, if there is a hymn you like in the Blue hymnal... it's in *Glory to God*.
- The 65% of the Blue hymnal only constitutes 50% of the new hymnal.
- This means there are over 400 new hymns in the *Glory to God*!

To raise the funds necessary for *Glory to God*, the Session has approved the selling of dedications for each hymnal. Each dedication will be attached to the inside cover of the hymnal and will cost \$20.

“What about the Blue hymnals?”

- If you or your family purchased a Blue hymnal dedication, you will be encouraged to take that hymnal home after *Glory to God* is adopted in mid-April. The Worship and Music Committee will label all the blue hymnals for pick-up.

We hope that you will consider purchasing a hymnal in honor or in memory of a loved one. Please fill out the forms below and return them to the office.
