GENEROSITY SHOWS AS WE HELP GOD'S CHILDREN AROUND THE WORLD

A few weeks ago, Dr. Harvey reminded us in worship that “generosity begins at home” as we in our church care for one another. In that sermon, Alan was also quick to mention that “generosity doesn’t end at home.” After Jesus was raised from the dead, and right before he ascended to heaven, He spoke to His disciples who were feeling at home in Jerusalem and said:

“⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” (Acts 1:8)

The story that is told from that time on involves Christ’s followers helping people literally around the world

Helping People in Florida Through Presbytery Missions

Beyond our city, we use gifts given to our church to support the work of the Presbytery of Tampa Bay. Together with 70 other Presbyterian Church (USA) congregations, our presbytery is a mission partnership allowing us to conduct ministry which is larger than what most churches can handle alone. In this mission partnership, new churches are being organized and disciples are being nurtured in the greater Tampa Bay region. Our mission work also helps provide for faith formation at the Cedarkirk Camp and Conference Center and Eckerd College. Our mission in the Presbytery of Tampa Bay also includes providing spiritual and physical support of migrant farm workers and their families through the varied ministries of the Beth-El Mission in Wimauma (just south of Tampa).



Through the International Partnership Committee and the mission partnership between the Presbytery of Tampa Bay and the Presbytery of Honduras, members from our congregation have engaged in week-long mission trips to the country of Honduras in 1998, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2011 and 2014. During these wonderful mission experiences, youth and adults from First Pres. have felt their faith in Christ deepen as we worked alongside our Honduran brothers and sisters in Christ building churches, offering medical care, and sharing the love of Christ throughout Central America.

World Missions

Nationally and internationally, along with 11,000 other PC (USA) congregations, people are being trained and supported in ministry and mission personnel are blanketing the globe with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Our church’s investment in World Missions includes our shared ministry in Presbytery (Cedarkirk, Beth-El and The Tampa Bay Presbytery International Partnership with the Presbytery of Honduras), and our support of five General Assembly Mission Partners: John McCall, mission co-worker in Taiwan; Rev. Josh and Kim Vis, mission co-workers in Brazil; Ruth Brown, mission co-worker in Congo; Rev. Derek Forbes, mission co-worker in Zimbabwe; and Sharon Bryant, mission co-worker in Thailand.

Over the past year, our congregation has also shared God’s love world-wide as we collected **\$5,660** in our Christmas Eve Offering for Medical Missions. These gifts went to support the Medical Benevolence Foundation Mobile Health Clinics in Malawi, Bangladesh and Haiti, and Dr. Moreno’s Clinic at the Pena de Hereb Presbyterian Church in Tegucigalpa, Honduras.

At Easter, we gave **\$3,944** to the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering to provide relief to those affected by natural disasters (through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance), provide food to the hungry, and assist in helping to empower the poor and oppressed.

And in 2014, through our world mission budget, our congregation has supported the work of a son of our congregation, Rev. Dr. Fred Foy Strang, and the Training Center for Massai church leaders in Kenya and Tanzania. Our church made a gift of **\$3000.00** to help the Strangs in this vital ministry of sharing the gospel.

In the past twelve months, the generosity of the friends and members of First Presbyterian Church has shown as we have provided over **\$90,000** of mission support in these programs worldwide.





CONNECT With Us at Sunday School!



Children ages three and four gather in Room 108 for their own Sunday School time of crafts, snack, Bible lesson, and fun.



Connect - Grow - Thrive meets in Room 207. The class has been studying the book, *The Life You've Always Wanted: Spiritual Disciplines for Ordinary People* by John Ortberg. All are invited to join in this discussion filled class. Members of the class take part in leading the discussion each week.



The Perspectives Class meets in the Geneva Room and is facilitated by Dr. Jim Threlkel and Glenn Thomas. They are focusing on Martin Thielen's book, *What's the Least I Can Believe and Still Be A Christian?* Everyone is invited to join in this thought-provoking discussion time. Pastor and author, Martin Thielen, has compiled a list of ten things people need to believe and ten things they don't, in order to be a Christian. This lively and engaging book will be a help to seekers as well as a comfort to believers who may find themselves questioning some of the assumptions they grew up with.

Dr. Steve Negley's class meets in the back of McLeod Hall. The topic is: **Mastering the Basics in I John**. This eight-week study will take the class on a journey through a little book (I John) tucked near the back of the New Testament. Long before C.S. Lewis and his look at "Mere" Christianity, a writer named John was putting pen to papyrus and helping early Christians explore the essential elements of their faith. Addressing a congregation where faith and practice had taken some wrong turns, John shared the good news of how things could move in the right direction. Bring your Bible and be prepared to explore how we can walk in the Light and walk in love; test the spirits and be aware of antichrists; live as children of God who love one another; and revel in how God's love inspires our love.
