


SUNDAY, MARCH 15 WILL BE THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN THE SEASON OF LENT



Easter lilies are a yearly tradition to decorate the church on Easter Sunday. To purchase a lily "in honor of" or "in memory of" a loved one or friend, please fill out the order form below.

The cost is \$12.00 per plant. Checks should be made payable to First Presbyterian Church and marked "Easter Lily Fund". Place the order form and check in the offering plate, mail, or take to the church office by **Monday, March 30**. A complete listing will be available Easter Sunday.

The Sanctuary Committee will again remove the yellow stamen from each lily so it will not bother your allergies.

DO YOU KNOW WHAT NEEDS TO HAPPEN BEFORE THE COMMUNION TRAYS ARE PASSED TO YOU?



The table must be covered with the under tablecloth. The bread must be cubed and put into plastic bags. The bread trays must be collected. The cups must be put in the holders of the trays and filled with grape juice. The bread, bread trays, and filled cup trays must be transported to the sanctuary as well as those prepared for the station from which the sacrament will be served in the balcony. The table must be set with these trays, the loaf of bread, the chalice, and the pitcher. Once these are in place the table is veiled.


After communion has been served for The Gathering Service at 8:50 a.m., there is tidying up and re-setting the table for the 11:00 a.m. service. Once communion has been served, the table must be cleared of all the trays, chalice, pitcher, and cloths. These are taken downstairs to be washed or cleaned and then returned to their storage places in the kitchen and elsewhere.

A lot happens before <u>and after</u> the communion trays are passed to you! We have a skeleton crew of faithful volunteers who serve you in this way, but <u>we need more!</u> Please consider this invitation to serve and if you feel that you are being called to assist in this important act of ministry, then please call Alan at the church office at 294-3121.




Generosity Shows in Our Church Facilities

The family of faith at First Presbyterian Church is truly blessed with a great complex of buildings in which to worship, learn of God's love, partake of fellowship with sisters and brothers in Christ, and use as a mission outpost for service to God in the world. Our church is blessed by wonderful physical resources for ministry.





Our sanctuary building provides two magnificent spaces for the worship of God: our sanctuary (with a seating capacity of 700) and our chapel (for weddings, funerals, Christ Kids' worship and other events for groups of 80 or smaller). The sanctuary building also houses our kitchen, McLeod Hall, the church offices, the Price and Spencer Libraries, the Music Suite, and various meeting rooms.





The Helen Haines Christian Education Building is the nerve center for our educational programs. The Nursery Suite, our Rotation Workshop Centers, the Children's Library, Children's Worship Center, Enrichment Room, Teacher Resource Center, and various adult classrooms fill the building.





The Student Center (at 711 Sixth Street, NW) which is currently undergoing repairs and renovations --- is home for our Middle School Youth, Senior High Youth, on Sundays and throughout the week.



The Recreation and Community Service Building at 737 Sixth Street, NW allows us to have covered recreation for our children and youth, a shop and storage for our maintenance director, and community outreach programs such as the Saturday Soup Kitchen and Saturday Nite Live.



The T Oakley Andrews Scouting Center is the base for Boy Scout Troop 121.



Our buildings also provide a basis for outreach in our community. Many people have their initial encounter with First Pres. through the doors of our Christian education buildings, not for Sunday School, but for meetings of community sponsored groups such as Al-Anon, the Alpha Jewels, the Quilters, the Stamp Club, the Magic Club.

Through the generosity of the members and friends of First Presbyterian Church, over the past year we have invested over \$200,000 in maintaining God's house, so that our congregation could offer all these different avenues for Christian ministry. These generous tithes and offerings have covered the costs for utilities, maintenance supplies, and insurance, and provided the services of Sam Bryant, our full-time Director of Facilities and Maintenance and Ann Quessenbery, our full-time Custodian. Your generosity shows each time God is praised in our wonderful facilities!

SUNDAY WORSHIP SCHEDULE

At 8:50 a.m., members and friends of First Presbyterian Church are invited to attend The




Gathering. This service is held in the sanctuary. The piano is the primary instrument for leading in congregational music with a variety of instruments adding special touches from week to week. The prayers in worship and the flow of the service help the congregation gather in God's love. The Gathering ordinarily lasts 50 minutes and will conclude with the Benediction at 9:40 a.m.

At 11:00 a.m., you are invited to attend our later morning worship. This service is held in the sanctuary with music and responses regularly led by our chancel choir and accompanied by organ and piano. In the tradition of our church, cultivated over the last few decades, a full liturgy gives the congregation opportunities for spiritual enrichment and the sense of God's love and grace. This worship service ordinarily lasts one hour and concludes with the Benediction at 12:00 p.m.
