
...will be heading out on **Monday, May 18** to Yoder's Restaurant and Amish Village in Sarasota

FRIENDSHIP CALLERS

Visitation Ministry-- A Tangible Way to Share Our Faith

First Presbyterian Church has had a blessed ministry of visitation for a very long time. Take a moment to think about it; a visitation ministry is truly a tangible way of sharing our Saviour Christ's compassion and as a demonstration of our faith in the caring way which Jesus lived.

A Visitation Ministry in our church follows the lead of the Messiah, our pastors, and a devoted group of volunteers who work in concert with our Minister of Visitation. I overheard a volunteer say out loud, "I love doing this so much I would pay for the opportunity to visit those whom we visit."

I know there are some of our members who would like to be a Friendship Caller but. . .! It is true that there are some who hesitate to volunteer because they may not be comfortable visiting those who had been in hospitals, a nursing home, or any other long-term care situation. They feel as if they might not know what to say, should they stand or sit, how long to stay, what if they already have a visitor – and the questions begin.

None of the above should stop you from becoming a Friendship Caller. Our Friendship Callers meet once a month where we have opportunities to learn how to make our visits. We learn from each other as we review and discuss the different situations we may have with our visits. In our monthly meeting we can share our concerns without sharing the name of the people we visit. The Friendship Caller can look over the list of our friends who could and/or should be visited.



Whenever we meet to discuss our visits, we remind our visitors to respect the privacy of the person they are visiting. There should not be any discussion of the person's private affairs, appearance, or their condition.

Visitation Ministry is a wonderful way to share our faith with others. Perhaps more is the growth we ourselves experience as we become more comfortable in our visiting with our shut-in friends and members.

Should you wish to join our Visitation Ministry, simply get in touch with Ray Larson, our Minister of Visitation. Ray will explain everything and answer your questions

THE REORGANIZATION AND REACTIVATION OF THE PRAYER CHAIN MINISTRY

The Prayer Chain Ministry is under the supervision of the Congregational Care Committee. This ministry is distinct from the calls that come into the church for individuals or families to be placed on the church's prayer list that is printed in the bulletin and the church's newsletter, *Tower Chimes*.

This ministry could be described as crisis intervention. Volunteers have consented to offer special prayers immediately for individuals or families at times when crises become known, e.g. a serious or very risky operation, a tragic accident, a complicated pregnancy, etc. At times the person(s) requesting prayer may not wish to divulge certain particulars of the situation and we respect their privacy. In those circumstances we will not pry or solicit more information than they are willing to share freely and have shared with others dedicated to this ministry. We will lift the individual or persons up in prayer with the confidence that God knows their situations and needs even better than we do, but nevertheless we want to assure them that he/she is or they are being remembered in and supported by our prayers.

Jane Ray has agreed to serve as the Coordinator of this ministry. Those desiring that the prayer chain be activated are asked to call Jane at 318-1833 and to let their request be made known. Once Jane has been informed of the prayer concern, she will activate the prayer chain.



SUNDAY WORSHIP SCHEDULE

At **8:50 a.m.**, members and friends of First Presbyterian Church are invited to attend The Gathering. This service is held in the sanctuary. The piano is the primary instrument for leading in congregational music with a variety of instruments adding special touches from week to week. The prayers in worship and the flow of the service help the congregation gather in God's love. The Gathering ordinarily lasts 50 minutes and will conclude with the Benediction at 9:40 a.m.



At **11:00 a.m.**, you are invited to attend our later morning worship. This service is held in the sanctuary with music and responses regularly led by our chancel choir and accompanied by organ and piano. In the tradition of our church, cultivated over the last few decades, a full liturgy gives the congregation opportunities for spiritual enrichment and the sense of God's love and grace. This worship service ordinarily lasts one hour and concludes with the Benediction at 12:00 p.m.

CONNECT WITH US AT SUNDAY SCHOOL!!!



Children ages three and four gather in Room 108 for their own Sunday School time of crafts, snack, Bible lesson, and fun.

We fed 90 people on 5/2/15.


