Making *FIRST PRES* Your *FIRST CHOICE* for Christian Fellowship

Do you recall the lyrics to the children's song, *The More We Get Together*? If not, then please let me refresh your memory. They are:

*The more we get together
Together, together
The more we get together
The happier we'll be
Cause your friends are my friends
And my friends are your friends
The more we get together
The happier we'll be*



Those words really apply to **everything** we do in the church. Let's consider the following examples.

Those who create prayer shawls could easily complete them at home, but they welcome the time to come together to catch up with other prayer shawl makers who crochet or knit, to see one another's progress and to enjoy conversation as they work.

Those who attend Sunday school classes look forward to reconnecting with the class members to learn what has been happening in their life the past week and what their plans are for the week ahead. For all Sunday school class members, but particularly with our children's Sunday school and Christ Kids' meeting on Wednesday afternoons, this may be the only time they will see one another each week.

Those who work in the Saturday Soup Kitchen show their concern for the poor and welcome the chance to prepare a nourishing meal for our guests. If they did not know one another when they arrived, they become acquainted and find joy in this particular ministry.

Those who come to Middle School and High School Youth Groups appreciate the chance to get together with their friends, a number of whom may attend different schools. Their time together to share a meal, to share faith and to share fun is one of true fellowship.

Those who come for bell or choir rehearsals on Wednesdays or Thursdays welcome the opportunity to make a joyful noise to the Lord. They derive joy in praising God and serving as worship leaders. They are committed to sharing their talents as they also enjoy one another's company.



Those who serve as Stephen Ministers come together to review the progress being made through their caring relationships. They gather together for prayer and support. As with others who have gone through similar circumstances, in this case the fifty hours of training, a special bond has developed amongst the members. They stay on task but appreciate the camaraderie they enjoy.

Those who gather on Sunday mornings for The Gathering service or the Traditional Worship service at eleven o'clock have selected places where they like to sit. Balcony sitters may appreciate the view from on high. Others on the floor level may have chosen certain seating for better lighting or being more removed from an air vent. Some may gravitate to the back or the front, the sides or in the middle. They have become acquainted with those seated around them and they welcome the opportunity to exchange pleasantries on Sunday mornings before worship begins.

Those who look forward to spending time at table with family members or friends are the ones who sign up for special events ... such as the After Christmas, Easter and Rally Day Breakfasts, the Patriotic Sing Along and Lunch, the Maundy Thursday Dinner, the Fall Festival, the Youth Sponsored Trivia Night, the All Church Talent Show and Dinner. Those arriving early will save spots for others planning to attend. They enjoy sharing a meal at church with their family members and friends. On Sunday mornings, folks gather around the coffee urns and the orange juice table to sample the goodies and enjoy OJ fellowship between The Gathering and Sunday school.

Those who prepare comfort food are pleased to participate in this valuable ministry to those who have been hospitalized or suffered the loss of a family member. They also have discovered that they enjoy cooking together. Those who preside at funeral receptions realize the importance of providing a setting for those grieving to be greeted by those who share their sorrow. They work well together and appreciate the opportunity to serve.

Those who love food and adventure have boarded our church vehicles for road trips to restaurants. The 10-2 Lunch Bunch has a ball chatting to and from the chosen restaurant as well as being at the table together. Our PrimeTimers venture out less and come to McLeod Hall for an interesting program and lunch. It is always fun to greet, meet, and eat!



What we see in all of these descriptions and other examples that space does not permit us to list is Christian Fellowship. The church provides us with many opportunities to come together and as the song says: *"The more we get together The happier we'll be."* These and other activities explain why Making FIRST PRES Your FIRST CHOICE for Christian Fellowship is a good thing!

Elementary aged children will enjoy the Workshop Rotation this Fall with Science, Movies, Art, Cooking, Storytelling, Games, and Library time!!

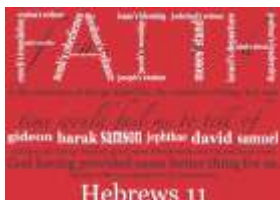
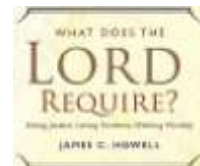
