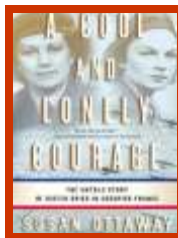

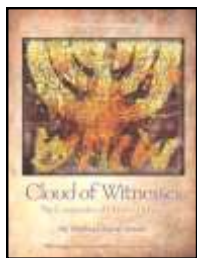

SEEKING A NEW ASSOCIATE PASTOR FOR CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND FAMILY MINISTRIES.

Since the start of the new year, members of our church's Christian Education Committee have been involved in discussions with Dr. Evelyn McMullen, our Interim Director of Christian Education, regarding the past, present, and future of Christian education and faith development in the church. In the past few months, members of the Session have joined in this season of discernment. After prayerful conversation and reflection, the Session has decided to move toward filling our staff vacancy in the area of Christian Education with a new Associate Pastor for Christian Education and Family Ministries.

Following a process outlined by the Presbytery of Tampa Bay's Commission on Ministry (which has approved our church's desire to create this new ordained position), our church's Nominating Committee has met and is proposing the following church members for election to and service on an Associate Pastor Nominating (Search) Committee:

These nine people (5 women and 4 men) are a representative cross-section of our congregation. They have each agreed to serve, if elected by the congregation. Four of the nominees are under age 45. Three members of this proposed slate are in the 46-65 age group in our church. Two proposed members for the committee represent the 66 and up age cohort of First Presbyterian Church. Dr. Steve Negley will also serve on the committee ex-officio.

9:15 – 10:45 a.m. The Connection

An extended fellowship time in McLeod Hall which offers a coffee bar type selection with different flavors, creamers, pastries, etc. The Connection is gathering place before (or after) worship, and between worship and Sunday School for some. Hosts circulate in McLeod Hall and the CE Building to assist people in making connections with others in one of the worship or Christian Education options.

9:30 – 10:45 a.m. Adult Sunday School

A variety of Christian Education classes are offered for adults. (Pre-care will be offered from 9:30 – 10:00 a.m. for the children of parents attending adult Sunday School. Church school staff/volunteers will escort pre-care children to music at 10:00 a.m.)

10:00 a.m. – 10:45 a.m. Children's Sunday School

We begin with music with Ms. Lynn at 10:00 a.m. and then children of all ages are welcomed to explore faith in their own classes

9:30 - 10:25 a.m. Heart of Worship

A Praise and Worship service held in our sanctuary. Along with scripture, sermon, and prayers, a praise band helps the congregation in adoring and showing reverence to God. Following the Time with Younger Disciples, children are invited to join Ms. Lynn in music and then to join in their own Children's Sunday School Classes.

11:00 a.m. Sanctuary Worship

A traditional worship service held in our sanctuary. The service follows the same order as the 8:15 a.m. Chapel Service, and includes music from the Chancel Choir and the organ, as well as other instruments and groups.

SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR ALL AGES

If your family attends the 11:00 a.m. service, come to the CE Building for music and classes from 10:00 until 10:45 a.m.

For Adults: From **9:30 until 10:30 a.m.** in the Geneva Room is the Perspectives Class. A low-keyed round table discussion group of adult Christians who learn and grow from shared insight and perspectives. Discussions are led by Dr. Jim Threlkel and Mr. Glenn Thomas. Study topics follow the outline of great books. **September 10** continues a study of William Barclay's [The Mind of Jesus](#).

Also for Adults: *What Do We Believe? In Words & Images*. We will study the creeds of the church for 3-weeks.
